The day will comprise workshops, training sessions, discussions, presentations and networking opportunities.

Stream A – Chairs

The Institute has a new strategy that puts “Making IT Good for Society” at the very heart of its work, which is underpinned by three strategic pillars: community, excellence and leadership. It has also set four challenges in (1) capability, (2) health and care, (3) personal data and (4) education to get us started.

It is clear that the member groups' community will have a vital role in delivering this strategy as we set out on this new path together. We want to empower our member groups to make a real impact in delivering this new mission.

Each group, under the leadership of its chair, will need to think through how it will be “Making IT Good for Society”. There is an opportunity here for each group to make a real difference to society in its own unique way.

How do we ensure strategic alignment so we don't waste voluntary effort? How can we spread emerging best practice? What support do member groups need? These are some of the questions we must start asking ourselves over the coming months as we all contemplate what this new direction means for the organisation.

This workgroup will focus on some preparatory steps to get the right communication channels in place to ensure good strategic alignment, improve the capture of best practice and hone how member groups receive support.

In this session, we particularly want to revisit how member groups communicate their achievements to their peers and how the Best Practice Committee can support them in aligning their goals to the new strategy so that as a community we can make a real difference for society.
